



**TENTH AMENDMENT TO DECLARATION MADE MARCH 2020 OF LOCAL  
DISASTER DUE TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY FOR CITY OF LINDALE, TX**

**WHEREAS**, the World Health Organization has declared the coronavirus, now designated COVID-19, as a global pandemic on March 11, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, coughing and shortness of breath, and can range from mild to severe illness, which may lead to further complications including death; and

**WHEREAS**, the COVID-19 virus mainly spreads between people who are in close contact with one another through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes ; and

**WHEREAS**, the continued worldwide spread of COVID-19 presents and imminent threat of widespread illness, which requires emergency action for the protection of the people of City of Lindale; and

**WHEREAS**, Governor Abbott has a plan to do a slow reopen of Texas as found in 'The Governor's Report to Open Texas" dated April 27, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor, declared the City of Lindale Texas a local state of disaster due to public health emergency under section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code; and

**THEREFORE**, the city modifies its order as stated below.

## **Closed until October 31, 2020**

1. Kinzie Community Center
2. Pickers Pavilion

The above facilities will remain closed due to inability to regulate occupancy as per the Governor's order; order may be reviewed and updated if the Governor changes his order.

The Mayor and City Council would also encourage the public to continue following the President and CDC recommendations for gatherings.
